### About the services

College Eucharist — with hymns, and a sermon, and in modern language. Any baptized Christian is welcome to receive Communion, regardless of Church affiliation.

***Followed by breakfast in A1.***

Choral Evensong — A traditional language service of music and prayer. The choir do most of the singing. On most Sundays there is an address or sermon.

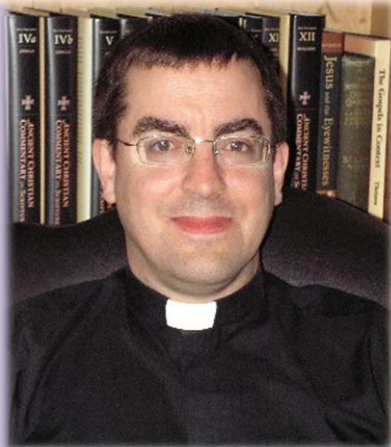
Sung Compline — A short service, dating from mediaeval monasteries, designed to still heart and soul at the end of the day.

Daily Prayer — A brief time out from the business of the day (about 15 minutes), including silence, prayers for the College and its members, but no music.
