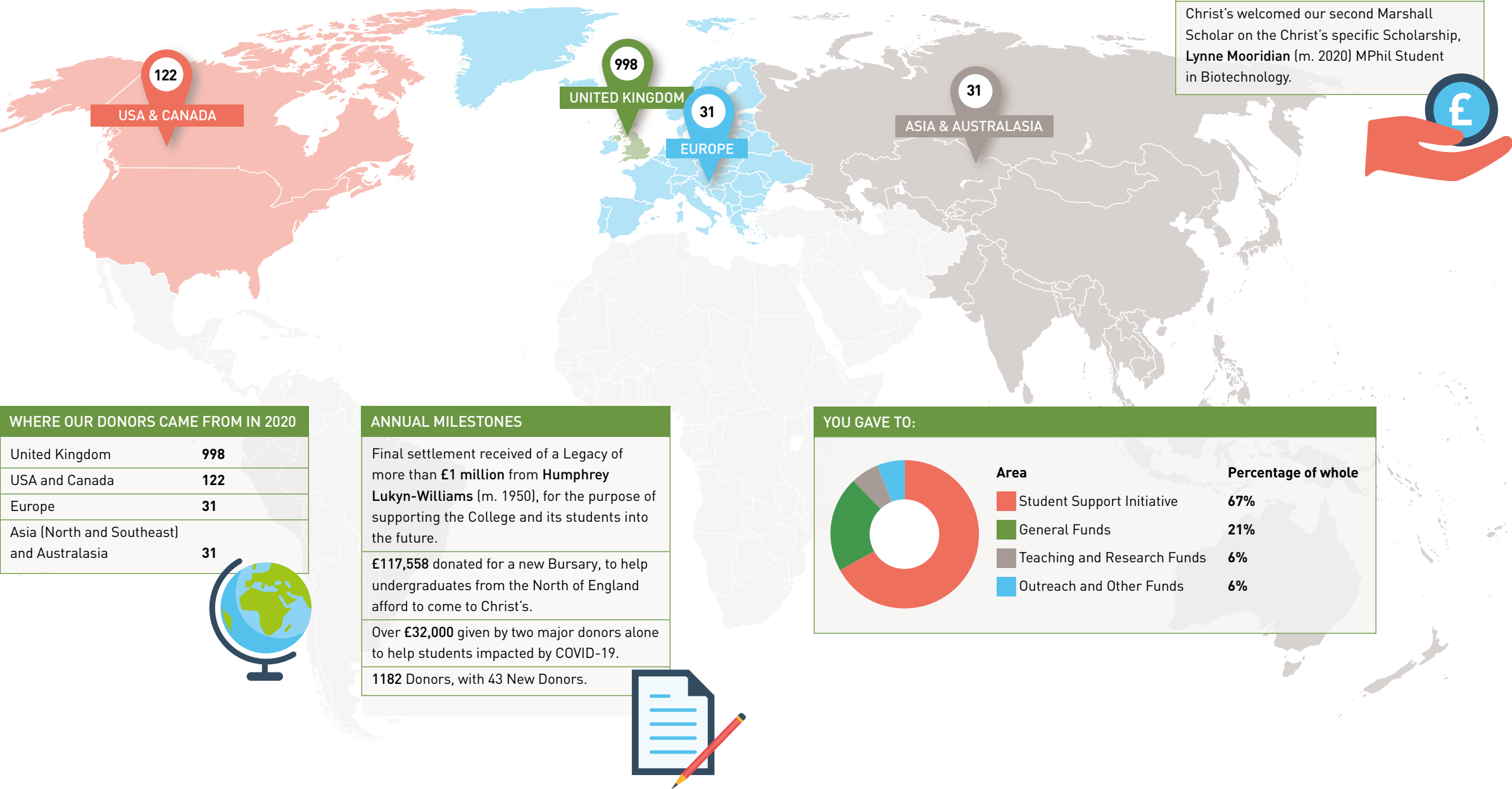

## DONATION IMPACTS

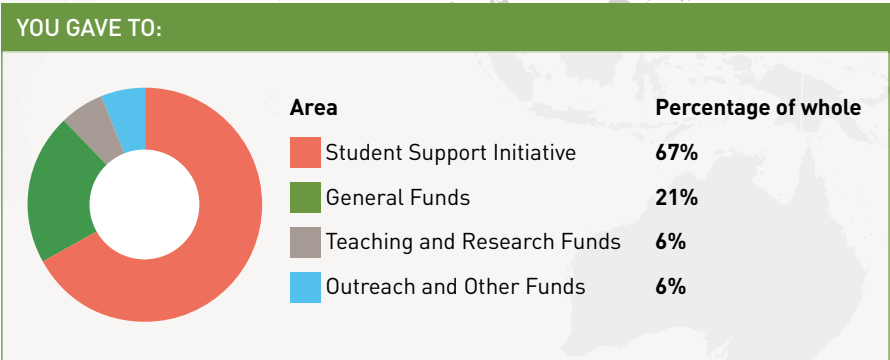
A temporary marquee put up in Second Court for Michaelmas, and multiple new benches installed throughout College, to let students socialise outside within the pandemic restrictions.

# CAMPAIGN Progress

RESPONDING TO COVID-19

THIS YEAR, MANY OF OUR CAMPAIGN PRIORITIES WERE PUT ON HOLD, IN ORDER TO FOCUS ON THE NEEDS OF THE COLLEGE DURING THE PANDEMIC; FOCUSING TRULY ON **ENHANCING COLLEGE LIFE**, SO THAT OUR STUDENTS WERE ABLE TO MAKE THE MOST OF THEIR EDUCATION WHILST STILL IN LOCKDOWN.

Some of this work involved more structural upgrades, including increased spending on our Wi-Fi and IT provisions, so that staff could upload lectures, tutorials, and other resources for students to learn, as well as purchasing numerous Zoom licenses for every College department. Other changes were devoted towards keeping Christ's COVID-secure, with one way systems installed, and student accommodation redistributed to allow social distancing.

Of course, one of the central tenets of the Campaign has always been ensuring there is more to a Christ's education than just the academic experience, and thus a large focus of Lockdown work was directed towards enabling the College community to continue to gather in this changed situation. From Zoom quizzes, to relay races, and even online crafting sessions, resources were provided to keep students in contact with each other, and the wider College community.

The most notable of these initiatives was the 'Senior Tutor's Prizes'; a series of awards, funded by the College, for both student societies and households who organised online events, either competitive or non-competitive in nature. These awards could be monetary to pay for supplies, such as books or knitting materials, funds for general society purposes, or small prizes to encourage student participation. A 'Senior Tutor's Prize for Most Innovative Online Activity' was also awarded to the Christ's College Art Society for their art exchange, which took place in Lent 2021 – the website of entries can be found at <https://www.cas.gallery/>. Not only did this increase morale amongst the students, it kept everyone connected at a time when they needed this most.

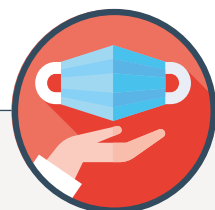




## FOCUSSING ON MENTAL HEALTH £60,000 provided since March 2020 for Individual Counselling sessions

One of the most significant, but easiest to overlook, impacts of the pandemic was on the mental health of members of the College. The psychological impact of Lockdown is something that has been well documented in the press, and Christ's has been working hard to mitigate this for our students. Efforts have been taken to encourage students to get involved with the wider community, as seen elsewhere in the Donor Report, and financial aid given to prevent our undergraduates and graduates having to worry about their finances in addition to everything else, all funded by the College.

In some cases, however, more direct support was needed: from the pastoral, including encouraging students to reach out to tutors, and drop-in remote counselling, to the provision of resources, including podcasts by the University counselling service on a wide range of relevant topics. For those most in need, one-on-one sessions with Christ's counsellors took place to help students cope with the very different world we have all found ourselves in.



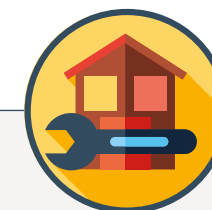
## RESPONDING TO COVID-19



Just some of the pandemic related expenditures that donor support helped to fund include:

- £44,000 on COVID-19 security measures, including screens, cleaning products, and hand sanitiser stations
- £10,300 on masks for students
- Digital Gateway Grants totalling £24,000, to fund Laptops and other equipment for students from deprived backgrounds, expanding on the University's scheme

Thank you for enabling this, and all the other work the College has been able to do to keep our community safe in the pandemic.



## KING STREET REDEVELOPMENT

Whilst much was delayed by the odd circumstances of 2020, one Campaign priority that was able to be worked on at full speed was the redevelopment of King's Street and Fourth Court.

The shed, that has dominated New Court for years, was finally taken down in the Summer Vacation, and work began in earnest, including a temporary removal of the gate to the side of College. Alongside this, trees were removed, on-site offices set up (to keep to COVID-19 regulations), and all necessary provisions were put in place to continue work even with students on the Christ's site.

Construction work then started in earnest in January 2021, led by R G Carter Construction, with a planned completion date of the end of 2022.



Fundraising for this project is still ongoing, and we look forward to providing you with more news as the project progresses.



Whilst COVID-19 put a damper on much of the College's activities, it did allow us to complete building work that otherwise would have had to take place around student, and alumni, life – such as the new Collyweston slates installed for elevating the First Court roofing, finishing renovations there that had been begun in 2019. Other essential renovations were done in Second Court over the summer, to ensure that, when students returned, it was to a safe working environment and living space.

# LIVING IN COLLEGE IN LOCKDOWN

---

WHILST WE WERE ABLE TO AID THE STUDENT BODY IN THE RETURN HOME NECESSITATED BY THE COVID-19 LOCKDOWN, SPENDING C.£25,000 FROM MARCH 2020 TO JANUARY 2021 ON HARDSHIP GRANTS FOR ACCOMMODATION, FLIGHTS, AND MEDICAL SUPPORT, NOT EVERYONE WAS ABLE TO LEAVE CHRIST'S.

Indeed, roughly one hundred students had to remain in College during Lockdown, due to not being able to travel abroad, or having home situations that meant they were, for one reason or another, unable to live and study there.

However, not only were we able to provide for the accommodation costs of these students, but also ensured that food was bought in by members of the Accommodation team, and the Porters were

available 24/7 in case of emergencies. They were also able to enjoy a unique experience of the Christ's grounds, tended to by our gardening team, and some of the wildlife that made their home there in Lockdown: squirrels, a heron, and even a family of foxes!

# OUR STUDENT SUPPORT Initiative

AS WITH MOST ELEMENTS OF LIFE AT COLLEGE, THIS UMBRELLA OF FUNDS HAD TO ADAPT IN ORDER TO SUPPORT STUDENTS THROUGH COVID-19, PROVIDING FOR THE EVOLVING CHALLENGES OF THE PANDEMIC.

For some students, who faced very turbulent financial situations due to their parents' and guardians' employment being threatened by Lockdown, our bursary support was what allowed them to continue to study here. This stretched what we were able to provide as a College, but enabled us to maintain our commitment to ensure that no student should be kept from studying at Christ's by financial difficulties.

This increased expenditure was, unfortunately, coupled with a reduced income from B&B accommodation and conferencing from the summer; the money we make from this is pooled with funds raised throughout the year to bolster the support we can offer our students.

Alongside this, we had to cancel our annual Telephone Campaign, with the first night of calling due to take place on the day before the University

announced that all students should return home, where possible. Intended to raise around £230,000 over the next three years for Christ's student support work, being unable to hold this was a real blow for our fundraising efforts.

Despite this, we were blown away by the generosity that alumni showed towards Christ's in the months following Lockdown. The mailing to those we contacted in the Telephone Campaign, who we were unable to call, raised over £55,445, which was truly valued in the depths of the pandemic. More than just the financial support, however, the inspiring words that came with the donations were just as valuable; one particular comment that stuck with us being 'during the COVID-19 Lockdown, the College [will] need all the help she can get from her old members'. Thank you, truly, for all the help that you responded with.

## International Awards for Undergraduates – EU

£50,000 annually to support EU Undergraduates



Students from the EU currently make up around a fifth of Christ's undergraduate cohort, adding to the diversity of the College, and enabling all our students to learn and work alongside others whose experiences and backgrounds are unlike their own. With strong links to outreach networks across Europe, including Denmark, Eastern Europe, and Cyprus, as well as our own Director of Admissions, Dr Emily Tomlinson, serving on the board of the international charity Project Access, we have been proud of the number of EU students we have been able to welcome over the years.

However, with the UK's decision to leave the EU, most new European students will no longer be eligible for consideration as home students, instead having to pay international fees of up to £58,038 a year; out of the reach of many from poorer backgrounds. In order to prevent this change from discouraging talented students, Christ's is developing a series of five scholarships, each

of £10,000 p.a., with the aim of maintaining the diversity of the College that has been so critical to our success in recent years.

More than this, our intention is to double the impact of gifts towards this new initiative, by waiving College fees of £9,400 for every student in financial need awarded such a scholarship. This innovative new initiative will only be possible thanks to the generosity of donors, and we hope you keep an eye out for future developments.

The difference these awards will make is illustrated by the responses we already receive from EU students for their financial support. 'I know that Christ's is truly dedicated to the mission of widening participation, and continues to support their students, both financially and in other forms, throughout their time in Cambridge. It would be a shame if future generations of young talented people from less privileged backgrounds were denied the chance to grow and progress that I've received from Christ's!' – **Maria** (m. 2019) *pictured*, from Poland, reading English.

## The difference of giving to just one student's life



**Jasmine** (m. 2018) *pictured*, reading History of Art, is just one of the many overseas students whose life at Christ's was heavily impacted by the pandemic, her travel and living plans disrupted by COVID-19 on every level. However, thanks to the generosity of our alumni, Christ's was able to aid her every step of the way.

Since March 2020, she has received the following support from College, financed by our Student Support Initiative, in order to ensure she could continue to thrive in her education without being burdened by these financial difficulties:

- £1,000 at the start of the pandemic in order to cover her unexpected travel expense back home
- £500 from a Digital Gateway Grant, to purchase a new laptop to engage with online learning
- Two grants from the Hardship Fund to cover unexpected expenses in the Michaelmas term
- Fourteen days of rent payment as a vacation study grant, to aid with rent over the Christmas holiday so she didn't have to make an expensive journey home.

In her own words, 'the more I listed the more appreciative I felt!'

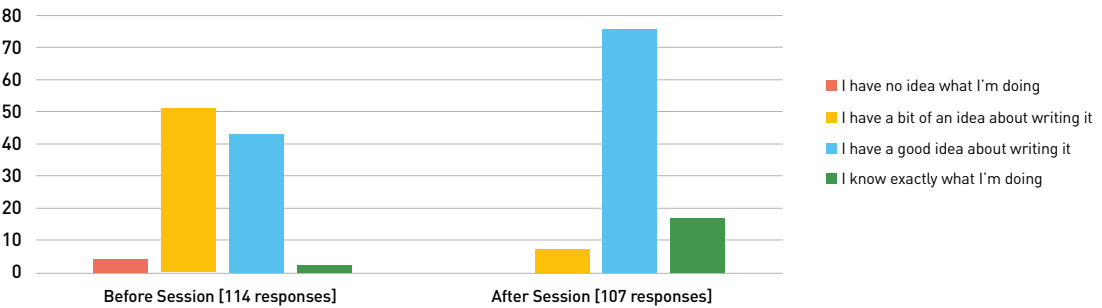
Whilst there were some opportunities in early 2020 to hold in-person events, from the first Lockdown onwards every single element of the College's Outreach work had to be moved online; Ellie Wood, the new Admissions and Outreach Officer, even had to begin her job remotely after joining the College in April.

The most dramatic change was that all the advice, usually given at Open Days and school visits throughout the year, had to be repackaged in a way

that made it accessible to a wide audience, and still useful for potential applicants. In order to manage this, the Admissions Team developed an innovative series of Webinars, running throughout the year, on topics including virtual College tours, and an introduction to Cambridge, all taking place via Zoom.

The impacts of just one of these webinars, on Personal Statements, can be seen below in the responses to a survey taken before and after attendance.

## Christ's & King's Bridging Course

Organised prior to the pandemic, the 2020 Bridging Course was designed in collaboration with King's College, to help talented students from modest backgrounds whose educations have been disrupted "bridge the gap" between school and university. Consisting of lectures and supervisions, to help them adapt to the Cambridge teaching style, as well as support from an undergraduate mentor, the intention is to give these new students the skills and confidence to begin their courses in October.

Originally arranged as a three week stay in Cambridge, social distance regulations meant that it had to be changed to a two-night visit, followed by virtual lectures for the remaining time. However, reaction was highly positive, and Gonville & Caius intends to take part next year as well.
